

"Very truly I tell you, unless a kernel of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains only a single seed. But if it dies, it produces many seeds." ~ John 12:24 NIV

During the month of October we will be exploring how God is calling us to be fruitful in our gratitude and generosity. One of the places where we see Jesus speak about gratitude and generosity is when he speaks on discipleship.

Living in Indiana, it is almost impossible to not see some form of field or farm in a five mile drive. We will soon begin to see combines filled with soybeans and corn filling trucks with their harvest to go to grain elevators to then sell and store the harvest. It always amazes me how so much abundance comes from a relatively small amount of seeds. The seeds die and, in their death, a transformation occurs. A new plant that produces exponentially more fruit/grain than the single grain/seed. It's amazing how much abundance comes from so little.

Jesus, as he is nearing his crucifixion, uses the imagery of a grain or kernel. If the kernel withholds itself, then the kernel remains a single kernel. However, when it gives of itself then there is fruitfulness and abundance. Jesus was/is not making a subtle point when it comes to our lives, our faith, and our resources. Jesus, alluding to his own death on the cross, calls for his followers to imitate him in their daily lives. Jesus did not hold tight to his own life but freely gave of his time, talents, and treasures. When we hold tight to our time, talents, and treasures we miss out on what could be through God. When we offer our whole selves to God, we then see and experience the fruitfulness of faith.





# MISSIONARY-MINDED PRAYER

An important part of missions is prayerfully supporting the church. Use this activity to guide your family's prayer time.

#### What you need:

- Plastic bag (large zippered)
- Permanent marker
- Bandage
- Toy plane
- Heart-shaped drawing or toy
- Spoon
- Coin
- Hot-sauce packet

#### What you do:

- 1. Label the bag with details about the missionaries you'll be praying for (names, location, specific needs).

Highlights from our September gathering: Social Action—a march was held in NYC, 9-17-23 at the United Nations Climate Ambition which is one of the studies of UWF.

Denise Geller gave a book report from Hiding in the Light by Rifqu Bary. At 7 years old she suffered an eye injury from an airplane her brother threw at her. The hospital in Sri Lanka wouldn't treat her because she was Muslim resulting in loss of vision in that eye. Her Dad was gone a lot and her Uncle raped her. She was shamed but he was not. Her family moved to NYC when she was 8 years old. They eventually moved to OH where she attended a public school and made new friends.

She went to a Christian friends home where they prayed to God. Her friend invited her to a youth group and she learns about Jesus. She gets a Bible and hides it. In the meantime, her parents had become mean. They slapped her on her cheeks a lot and endured beatings. At age 16 she left home and moved to Florida, hiding in various locations with help from friends there. Her parents couldn't find her and would have killed her if she was found.

This book is in our UWF Library by the lounge if you're interested in checking it out to read.

#### **Prayer Calendar**

"God is in this place, and I didn't know it!" Jacob exclaimed. (Genesis 29:16) That's often the case with us, too. During two years of pandemic crisis and isolation, we have often lost sight of God's faithfulness happening around us.

Wesley Foundation in Japan offers education grants for those who are studying in colleges and universities with hopes to serve others. However, many students' lives were hit hard by COVID-19.

When we held an online seminar for those who received the education grants, they expressed fears and frustration over the pandemic. "Why is this happening, Why is God silent?" Pain was real and sufferings were deep. Yet, one student said, "But when I received this grant, I see hope to finish my education." And another said, "I thought nobody cares about me anymore, but I realized God does. God cares for me because of the work of Wesley Foundation in Japan." God has been in this place and at work faithfully even during the crisis and sufferings, if only our spiritual eyes are open to see and recognize it. For this, we continue to reach out to students who have lost hopes and dreams.

From Pastor Jen's ministry: Diverse Missions & Justice, she reported on the program she attended Saturday, September 9 in Fort Wayne featuring Sarah Collins Rudolph as Keynote speaker. She was the 5th little girl, sole survivor, of the 1963 Birmingham, Alabama 16th St. Baptist Church bombing that was on the news.

Birmingham has never offered any reparation for the loss of one eye and emotional scars that would shape her journey. Her sister, Addie Mae Collins, was one of the girls who lost her life that day.

Determined to honor her sister's memory and seek justice, Sarah became a relentless advocate for civil rights. Despite facing threats and intimidation, her unwavering dedication played a critical role in the case's reopening and the eventual conviction of the perpetrators.

Sarah Collins Rudolph's story is one of resilience, determination, and unwavering spirit. Her journey from tragedy to triumph serves as a testament to the human capacity for transformation and the power of hope. Her legacy continues to inspire individuals around the world.
