The holiday season is upon us! We make plans, to do lists, and fill our calendars during these days. While we make grand plans for the perfect Christmas for our friends and family, sometimes an unlikely curve ball comes out of nowhere and changes everything. When the Christmas curveballs come, we are in great company. Nothing about the first Christmas was likely. Nothing went to plan exactly as the scholars and religious leaders expected.

What if our answered prayer for this Christmas season is an unlikely Advent? One that is filled with just the right curveball to shake us loose from our complacency and help us to see Christ anew? To turn our eyes off of ourselves and onto the Kingdom of God. The story of Advent is one of radical trust that we call faith. Mary and Joseph radically trusted God and each other. The shepherds radically trusted the angels to travel out of the fields to Bethlehem. The Magi radically trusted God's prophets to journey to the Christ child. Later, Mary and Joseph radically trusted God's instruction to take Jesus to Egypt to escape Herod's wrath.

When the Christmas curveballs come, and they will come, we are called to, just like those folks we see in our nativities, radically trust God and keep our eyes on Jesus. When the plans change maybe things are not falling apart, but falling into place. Remember, just like the first Christmas, God is with us.

This Advent we are going to journey through the stories of those persons in the Christmas story. We will be looking at these unlikely characters, how God invited them into his redemptive work and we are called to radically trust God in our own stories.

May this be an unlikely advent that leaves you changed for the better? As you see God at work in the unlikeliest Christmas story, may you see God at work in your own. May you radically trust God this holiday season as you love God and neighbor.

Open Hands Ministry

This is a group for adults of all ages. We will focus on adult community, spiritual growth, and hands that seek to serve our church, our community and our world.

<u>2024 Mission Trip:</u> The initial plans are established for the 2024 Mission Trip. This is for youth (grades 6-12) and adults. We will be traveling to Dayspring Native American UMC where we will be working on their worship facility. Dayspring is located on a 42 wooded acre lot in the middle of a city. They have approximately 30 regular congregants. They worship Creator (Father, Jesus, Holy Spirit) using Native American music, drums, and ceremony as a way of connecting, praying and praising. 

I was able to understand and answer many of the questions I asked God.

Thank God, there is the work of the Methodist Church and the Waldensian Church, which welcome you with a delicious and loving breakfast, and teach Italian in the church hall—one can see that there is Christian love, another view of the homeless. The church is present in many places with outstretched hands, a sign of God's love. I continue in the presence of God, I put my faith and hope in Jesus Christ.




