Do you have New Year's traditions? Some people place new socks by their beds so that when they wake up on January 1 they will have brand new socks for a brand new year. Others eat certain dishes for good luck. Others bang pots and pans at midnight scaring away the old year and welcoming the new year.

Whatever the tradition, there is a common thread in them all. The old is gone. The new has come.

When we look at our faith in Jesus, we see the perfect image of new birth and new life. Jesus told Nicodemus in a secret meeting at night that a person must be born again in order to enter the kingdom of God. Later on Paul stated that if anyone is in Christ then they are a new creation. Even in the Old Testament, God is calling forth new life into God's people. Whether in Isaiah where God is doing a new thing that leads to life in barren places, or in Ezekiel where God declares that God will give a new heart and spirit.

God is in the business of restoration and redemption.

Out of our old mistakes and shame and into our new future as redeemed and reconciled children of God.

The old is gone. The new has come.

May you step into this new year casting off the old that holds you back and trust in Jesus who gives you new life.

Geodes look plain on the outside but contain beautiful crystals. Create these "rocks" to show how God makes us new on the inside.

What you need:

- Clean cardboard egg carton
- Scissors (and adult help)
- Epsom salt
- Plastic zippered bags (one per color of dye)
- Food coloring
- Glue




What you do:

- 1. Cut out the tops and bottoms of all the egg compartments so you can make 6 ball shapes.
- 2. In each bag, put 3 tablespoons of Epsom salt and a drop or two of food coloring. Seal and shake to mix.
- 3. With the paintbrush, spread glue inside two egg-carton halves. Sprinkle a spoonful of Epsom salt into those halves. Then close and shake.
- 4. Open your homemade geode and shake out excess salt.
- 5. Optional: Preserve the crystals with a coat of clear-drying glue.






At this happy Christmas season We remember Christ our King, And though we have no costly gifts, Ourselves to him we bring




