So what are you giving up for Lent?

It is a question that some during the season leading up to Easter ask themselves and/or others. As if Ash Wednesday is a redo on New Year's Eve, many will look to improve their spiritual walk in some way starting this month. Some will give up a food, or something else like unplugging from social media or a streaming service. Whatever the fast you are choosing for Lent, I would invite you to consider these questions as you prepare for the upcoming church season:

Does fasting from (fill in the blank), make more room for God in my daily life?

Fasting during Lent is very common practice. The goal of fasting, as N.T. explains is "to be cleaned out and ready for the good things God has in store." Fasting should empower us to make room for the things that fill us with life and joy.

Does this move me towards the awareness of my reliance on God's grace through faith in Jesus?

Fasting (whether food or something else) is designed to create the reality of our total dependence on God's grace through Jesus.

"Self-denial means knowing only Christ, and no longer oneself. It means seeing only Christ, who goes ahead of us, and no longer the path that is too difficult for us.... Self-denial is saying only: He goes ahead of us; hold fast to him."

— Dietrich Bonhoeffer

Does this move me towards loving God and my neighbor more fully?

In Isaiah 58:6-9, God describes the fast that God's people should choose, and the fast is to love and serve their neighbor. To break the yoke of oppression. It is clear that to fast during Lent should not be simply centered on ourselves and God but also how we love and serve those around us.

"No act of virtue can be great if it is not followed by advantage for others. So, no matter how much time you spend fasting, no matter how much you sleep on a hard floor and eat ashes and sigh continually, if you do no good to others, you do nothing great."

— John Chrysostom

During this season of Lent, may you choose a fast that loves God and your neighbor more deeply. May you seek to make more room for God in your life and also the needs of those around you. May you rely on the cross of salvation more and more in your daily life. May God break you free from the old yokes that held you back so that you may break the yokes of injustice holding back others.



Make this heartfelt craft as a decoration or gift.

What you need:

- Yarn
- Scissors
- Parchment paper
- Baking sheet
- Heart-shaped cookie cutters
- ¼ cup cornstarch
- ½ cup water
- Adult help




What you do:

- 1. Cut yarn into 12-inch pieces.
- 2. Place cookie cutters atop a baking sheet lined with parchment paper.
- Combine cornstarch and water in a saucepan. Heat mixture over medium heat, stirring until thick and smooth. Remove from heat and cool to form a "glue."
- 4. Dip each piece of yarn into the mixture to coat completely. Squeeze off any excess.
- Place yarn in the cookie cutters, allowing pieces to cross and loop within the heart. Add more until the cookie cutter is filled and the yarn looks like a heart.
- Remove cookie cutters and bake the sheet for two hours at 150°F, or until hearts are dry and hard.




